MARTLESHAM MONTHLY MAMMALS

April:- Muntjac (*Muntiacus reevesi*) The Reeves muntjac was introduced from south east Asia to Woburn Abbey around 1900 and since then has spread throughout the UK in large numbers. This smallish deer starts breeding at 18 months old and can produce a fawn every 7-8 months. The male has small, sharp antlers and these are in velvet when growing between May to August, August to September they lose velvet and in April to May the following year they lose or cast their antlers. The muntjac is found where there is shrubbery or woodland and males often can be heard barking.

Your opportunity to have your say about issues that affect Martlesham; not a meeting of the Parish Council but we do give you a report of what we've been up to during the year. This will take place at 7:30 pm in the Parish Room (address below). All welcome.

Your Village Needs You

Nobody cares more about your community than you and your local council do! The next election of Parish Councillors takes place on Thursday 5th May. Martlesham has 3 wards with 15 seats to fill. Nomination papers are now available from Suffolk Coastal District Council (SCDC) or the Clerk. Delivery of nomination papers direct to SCDC takes place from Monday 21st March to noon on Monday 4th April. Latest date to withdraw candidature is noon on Thursday 7th April. If the number of candidates does not exceed the number of seats available, an election is uncontested, and the result will be published as soon as possible after 7th April. If an election is contested, we urge you to vote on Polling Day, 5th May.

Centenary Playspace Project

Work is due to start on 11 April 2011. We hope to have an official opening at the end of May – watch this space!

BMX Project

The Parish Council and the Police have for some time been concerned about the lack of facilities for teenagers. A Project Group (a subgroup of the Recreation and Amenities Committee of the Parish Council) has been set up with representatives from Martlesham Parish and Kesgrave Town Councils, the Police, Suffolk County Council and the young people themselves. Potential sites are being considered, funding has been obtained, and we are hoping to hold a 'Consultation Evening' before the summer, when you will be able to view the plans and ask any questions of the Project team. The date for the consultation will be advertised in the Mart-

Suffolk Coastal Local Development Framework - Consultation on the Reviewed Draft Core Strategy

SCDC postponed its full Council meeting on the Core Strategy due to reports on the impact of visitors on conservation sites in the 'Suffolk Sandlings'. A detailed analysis is now being carried out & it is likely to be late summer/early autumn before a decision is made. The determination of the BT planning application for 2,000 homes will also be delayed but we have no clear timescale. In the meantime we expect to receive an amended planning application from Bloor Homes for a development of 281 homes off Main Road. This application still remains contrary to the current Local Plan & the draft Core Strategy. For further information please refer to the SCDC website: www.suffolkcoastal.gov.uk.

JOHN KELSO'S DISTRICT COUNCILLOR REPORT

THE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT FRAMEWORK (LDF) LATEST (2000 homes adja- cent to Adastral Park)

Firstly can I take this opportunity to thank all those residents who took the time and trouble to attend the Special Suffolk Coastal Cabinet meeting which was held at Trinity Park on the 17th February. It was really great to see so many of you there. Unfortunately the Cabinet members decided to ignore our concerns and comments and recommended that the Full Council takes the document forward to the examination in public stage. The Full Council meeting was to have been held 9th March at Trinity Park as reported in last month's magazine but was postponed on

the 1st March due to a report being received from the Suffolk Wildlife Trust as part of the recent consultation exercise. The Trust raised concerns about the potential impact of visitors from the proposed future developments in areas to the north and east of Ipswich on the nature conservation sites in the 'Suffolk Sandlings', north of the river Deben. The Council has taken legal advice and was advised that the Wildlife report should be fully analysed prior to any further decisions being made on the Council's LDF Core Strategy. It is therefore very likely that no decisions will now be made until after the Council's elections due to be held in May and time will also need to be given to train any new Councillors in planning matters. So I believe it will probably be July at the earliest before this matter proceeds any further.

CHRIS BLUNDELL'S DISTRICT COUNCILLOR REPORT

The Core Strategy of the LDF: At the monthly meeting of the Suffolk Coastal District Council in February 2011 I asked a set of questions that had been supplied to me by NANT (No Adastral New Town) that concerned the research into the impact on the local environment. They had discovered that two E.U. Directives that concerned the protection of local wildlife and their habitats did not appear to have been adequately researched. The council officers were not able to adequately answer my questions. The Council officers also revisited a recently submitted 85 page statistical report by the Suffolk Wildlife Trust (SWT) that clearly demonstrated that any further development close to the River Deben would almost certainly impact on the wildlife and their habitats. SWT's report was primarily concerned with the area on the north side of the river where visitor numbers to such places as Sutton and Rendlesham Forest are already quite high and they were clearly mindful of the effect that any proposed new developments might have. The council officers together with the council leaders then decided that it would be prudent to delay the final presentation of the Core Strategy for acceptance by the full council until after these wildlife and other matters had been reconsidered. So the full council meeting scheduled for 9th March at Trinity Park Conference Centre was postponed. It is likely that the meeting to approve the Core Strategy of the LDF will not now take place until much later in the year because of the imminent elections and the need to train up any new councillors who may be invited to sit on the reconvened planning subcommittee after the elections. In the meantime it does indicate that any other proposed development such as the 'Bloor Home's Project' off Main

Road in old Martlesham will almost certainly be placed on hold until after the issues surrounding the Core Strategy have been resolved.

When you receive this report the election will be under way. I will still hold a surgery on Monday 4th April between 10 and 12 noon at St Michael's Church Hall but not in May since that will be the election week. NANT UPDATE

Suffolk Coastal's plan to allocate 2000 new houses at Adastral Park Martlesham is halted

At a recent Suffolk Coastal District Cabinet Meeting, Councillors and the general public were assured that all of the 1880 comments and objections received during the LDF consultation period had been analysed and that "they raise no major new planning issues". This is also stated in the report prepared for the Cabinet. Recent events have shown this not to be true.

On 28th February, SCDC issued a press statement in which it admitted that it had not taken into account a response received from Suffolk Wildlife Trust (SWT) on January 20th. The SWT objection is based on an important visitor survey report carried out at several of the area's internationally protected wildlife sites. SWT expressed concern regarding increased visitor numbers that will be generated from housing allocations such as those at Adastral Park. In order to meet its obligations under the European Habitats Directive the Council must conduct a full appraisal of the report.

One has to wonder why SCDC took the very unusual step of identifying a site-specific allocation of housing within its Core Strategy. The more usual process, followed by Councils across the country, is to agree the overall strategy for the district, which is then followed by a separate site allocation document at a later date. Given the contentious nature of the site-specific housing allocations at the BT site at

Adastral Park, one would imagine that many councillors are wishing that Suffolk Coastal had followed the more tried and tested process. The way in which this process has been handled is riddled with flaws with a budget that is escalating out of control.

A member of the council stated that this delay to the LDF "postpones the time when we can use it to protect our area from inappropriate development". This is not the case. Our area is very well protected from "inappropriate development" by the "saved" policies that are currently in place. In fact, under the current policies the area is protected from the most "inappropriate development" so far proposed - the one next to Adastral Park.

MARTLESHAM HEATH HOUSEHOLDERS LTD

In the woods behind Forest Lane we have been aware for some time that household items and compost bins have been deposited outside the gardens and therefore on our land. We have informed the residents, some of whom may not be responsible for the items as they have been there a long time, that these will be removed. (If you go to the MHH website you may be able to view pictures of the offending items.) This work will have to be paid from the maintenance charge and is not something we should have to do. We regularly ask people not to make use of open land beyond their boundaries but this practise continues and therefore is a cost to all of us when it needs rectifying.

The Council have recently sent out a Highways representative on a similar mission – namely, to identify when people's gardens are overhanging their boundaries and causing the footpaths to become narrower or impassable. He has identified certain properties and issued letters asking that the owner

gets the work done. As a property owner you have a responsibility to maintain your property and that includes its boundaries. On our part, we are cutting back yet more trees in line with the Highways Department's request. We have also asked a tree surgeon to start planting some new trees on the Heath and as this is in our control we can plant in more suitable places and with more suitable specimens than the original developers chose to put in.

The small green in Heathfield has had all the posts repaired, renewed and painted and it is looking very smart. It might take some time but the work gets done eventually so bear with us.

We are receiving funding from Natural England to improve the western corridor so you may see change happening a little faster there in the future. Anyone wishing to join the group that will oversee that work or become a Director on the Board of MHH should get in touch and another director will explain what we do and hopefully entice you to join us. David Cameron's Big Society doesn't seem to be working for us as it is painfully difficult to get volunteers to become directors. We are very lucky in having some very good volunteers who help on the Land Committee but we still need official directors.

David Cook is a local man with a lifelong passion for flying. He related how he first built a rigid wing glider to take part in the popular "Selsey Birdman Rally", a light hearted event to attempt to fly a distance of 50 yards from the lifeboat pier at Selsey Bill with a home-built glider. David failed to win the £3000 prize but came closest with a flight of 44 yards. He went on to design and build micro-lite powered hang gliders and personally flew across the English Channel in one. He has also established a microlite altitude record of 27000ft.

Several hundred have been built and are owned throughout the world. Due to disagreements with the Civil Aviation Authority production of these has ceased and David no longer holds his pilots licence. The title of David's illustrated talk was taken from his book, "Flying From My Mind."

A vote of thanks was given by our member, Ralph Rutherford, who is an ex-RAF Vampire pilot.

Our next meeting will be given by our member, Frank Bright who lives at Martlesham. The title is "Wrong Side of the Channel – life in German occupied Europe during WW2." This is a powerful personal story of tragedy, endurance and
