May:- Bank vole (*Ciethrionomys glareolus*). The bank vole is found in hedgerows and woodlands, a small creature with a chestnut brown fur on its back and a greyish underside. They can have 3-4 litters a year of 3-7 young and they build nests from grasses, leaves and bark, sometimes above ground, at the base of trees or in small tunnels.

The Portal Woodlands Conservation Group Nature Watch and Explorer groups have caught a number of them over the years.

MARTLESHAM/KESGRAVE BMX TRACK

Public Consultation Evening, Monday 6th June, at Martlesham Parish Room, Felixstowe Road, Martlesham, IP12 4PB, 7 to 9 pm.

For the past 12 months a working group from Martlesham Parish Council, supported by the Police, Kesgrave Town Council, the Youth Service and members of the public, has responded to the identified need for a sporting activity for young people in the area. This proposal originated from a meeting of the '12 Parishes Together' in 2010. The young people themselves wanted a series of BMX tracks, centrally situated, properly designed and monitored, for regular use by teenagers in Martlesham and Kesgrave.

The research into possible sites is now complete and funding to support this development has been acquired. The group will be mounting an exhibition on 6th June and all members of the public, young and old, are invited to come along to see what is being proposed, talk to group members and take the opportunity to make any individual written or oral comments for us to consider.

This is a much-needed facility and we hope that as many as possible will take the opportunity to support the project.

SWITCHOVER IS COMING AND HELP IS AT HAND

TV is switching to digital all over the UK and soon the traditional TV signal will be switched off in your area. If you don't have digital TV by the time of switchover, you will lose your TV channels.

Most people will find the switchover process easy, but for some the idea of switchover can seem a little daunting. There's no need to worry as help is at hand.

For older and disabled viewers who may find making the switch difficult, the BBC-run Switchover Help Scheme is at hand to provide everything you need to turn one TV set to digital.

Most people will be asked to pay £40 towards the standard option of help. This includes:

- easy to use equipment to convert one set
- an approved installer to supply and install the necessary equipment, and
- a 12 month aftercare service including a free helpline

The service is also free for people who are eligible and who also receive pension credit income support, income-based jobseeker's allowance or income-related employment and support allowance.

We can help you convert your TV to digital if you:

- are aged 75 or over, or
- have lived in a care home for six months or more, or
- get (or could get)
 - * Disability Living Allowance (DLA), or
 - * Attendance or Constant Attendance Allowance, or
 - * Mobility Supplement,
- or
- are registered blind or partially sighted

If you are eligible, the Help Scheme will write to you directly and in plenty of time to ask if you want our help. For further information on the Switchover Help Scheme visit helpscheme.co.uk or call 0800 40 85 900. Textphone users can call 0800 40 85 936.

The Election Results for Martlesham. I feel honoured to have been re-elected by you to serve for another term as your district councillor and I would like to thank all who voted for me. What Next? There is still the unfinished business of the LDF and further new tasks that await us in the form an Area Action Plan (AAP) for Martlesham and also the effects of the new Localism Bill which is likely to become law at about the start of 2012. I will continue to resist the damaging effects of the proposed excessive housing development to the south of Adastral Park and also keep an eye on the Bloor Homes planning application for Mr Pipe's field. Both of these planning applications are now likely to come before the Development Control Committee in the not too distant future. Suffolk Coastal DC will continue to work closely with Waveney DC with the objective of continuing to significantly reduce costs for both districts so that if we suffer a further reduction in government grants for 2012/2013 then we will be better placed to absorb them.

New trees have been planted in Lark Rise, Avocet and Lancaster. Also, we have had to remove trees in Lark Rise and Carlford. With the Council's permission we hope to plant new trees, in the autumn, along Eagle Way and, as old trees come down, to replace with more suitable specimens. We have asked the tree surgeon to water the new trees but I know one resident has already been out and watered one tree in Lancaster, for which we are grateful as there has been such an unusual lack of rain.

In the woods some trees have been pruned to improve their shape and some smaller saplings, that were growing too near the specimen trees, have been removed to allow more light and water to get to the trees. Logs placed under the trees, if left in place, form habitat for insects and small mammals.

Please be alert to youngsters (or others) starting fires. There has been a fire near Gorseland already and we have been lucky so far not to have one in the woods. Unfortunately, the fire brigade has confirmed that the majority of the fires have been started deliberately.

MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP

As we move through June we should see the emergence of the adult Silver Studded Blue butterflies on our heathland. This butterfly is very characteristic of heathland relying on heather as the larval food plant and having a complex relationship involving ants, which nurture the larva and pupa, with the adults emerging from ant colonies. We would expect to see the adult butterflies emerge some time towards the middle of the month.

We will aim to count the numbers of adult Silver Studded Blues towards the end of June possi-

bly on a Saturday or Sunday if the weather is suitable. Please contact me directly if you are interested in helping with the count on the site of special scientific interest.

Bracken has taken over on parts of the heath and has a detrimental effect both by shading out and also by dropping its fronds to form a mulch smothering lower growing plants including heather and acid grassland. Future work will attempt to check the growth of bracken and encourage more heather to flourish.

Our next work party will be on the western corridor heath site of special scientific interest on Sunday 12th June where we tackle some of the bracken. Please meet outside the Douglas Bader at 10 am or join us on the heath.

Please look out for wildlife and let us know if you see something interesting.
